


The following Team Thin Man Patrol Debrief relates how 2ndLt. David Skibbe, 23 of Des Plaines, Illinois ended up missing-in-action, MIA, on his first patrol with 1st Recon Battalion March 2, 1970. Sgt. Larry K. Gifford, 20 of Seattle, Washington was also seriously injured on this same patrol when they came in contact with enemy troops in the Que Son Mountains.

Skibbe had been in-country for 5 months with Fox Co., 2nd Battalion, 26th Marine Regiment as a platoon commander under Lt.Col. Bill Drumright, 2/26 commanding officer. When 2/26 rotated stateside, Skibbe secured a transfer to 1st Recon Battalion to again serve under Lt.Col. Drumright who had been reassigned as CO of 1st Reconnaissance Battalion.

1st Recon was sending out 7-man saturation patrols in February and March 1970 to locate an enemy build-up of troops in the Que Son Mountains in lieu of an attack on Da Nang. This patrol debrief provides the particulars as to how 2ndLt. Skibbe was left behind in the gathering darkness in the mountains.

SYNOPSIS: THIS PATROL COVERED A PERTOD OF 10.5 HOURS WITH 1 SIGHTING OF 2 VC. TEAM MADE TWO CONTACTS RESULTING IN TWO USMC WIA'S. THE ASSISTANT PATROL LEADER (WIA) WAS HOISTED UP BY THE JUNCHE PENETRATOR AND THEN IT WAS LOWEVED FOR THE PATROL LEADER (LT. SKIDDE). THE TEAM HOOKED THE PATROL LEADER UP WITH SAFTY STRAPS AND THE LT HAD PENETRATED THE CANOPY AND WAS APPROXIMATELY 100° OFF THE GROUND WHEN THE TEAM STATED TO GET READY TO BE EXTRACTED BY LADDER. THE TEAM UTILIZED 2 AO'S AND 1 FLIGHT OF FIXED WING WITH EXCELDENT COVERAGE OF TARGET.

5. ODSERVATION OF ENEMY AND TERRAIN:

A. ENEMY:

021330H VIC. ZCC21434 TEAM HEARD 3 RIFLE SHUTS (AK-47). ROUNDS WERE FIRED APPROXIMATELY 1,000 METERS WEST OF TEAMS POSITION. TEAM TOOK NEGATIVE ACTION DUE TO NOT BEING ADLE TO PIN POINT EXACT LOCATION.

C21630H VIC. ZC031436 TEAM WAS MOVING SOUTH SOUTHEAST ON HIGH SPEED TRAIL ON RIDGELINE WHEN POINTMAN STOTTED 2 VC WEARING BLACK PJ TOPS AND LIGHT COLORED SHORTS (KHAKI) CARRYING RIFLES AT SLING ARMS. ENEMY SPOTTED THE TEAM AT APPROXIMATELY THE SAME TIPE. ENEMY OPENEL FIRE WITH AUTOMATIC SMALL ARMS FIRE AND TEAM RETURNED FIRE AND ENEMY JUMPED OFF TO SIDE OF TRAIL. ENEMY CONTINUED TO FIRE RESULTING IN 1 USING WIA (KNEE, THUMD AND SCAP WOUND). EMEMY THEN IRCKE CONTACT.





ZC314436 THE PATROL LEADER WAS ADMINISTERING FIRST AID TO THE ASSISTANT PATROL LEADER WHEN THE ENEMY (ESTIMATED) 5 ENEMY INITIATED CONTACT WITH AUTOMATIC SMALL ARMS FIRE FROM APPROXIMATELY 20-30 METERS SCUTH-EAST OF TEAMS POSITION RESULTING IN 1 USMC WIA. TEAM SETURNED AUTOMATIC SMALL ARMS FIRE WITH UNKNOWN RESULTS. ENEMY CONTINUED TO FIRE FOR APPROXIMATELY 3 MINUTES AND THEN TRUKE CUNTACT. TEAM REQUESTED AU.

021645H VIC. 20314436 AO'S (HUSTAGE SIX, AND SCARFACE) ARRIVED ON STATION AND CONTINUED TO WORK OVER THE AREA WITH EXCELLENT COVERAGE OF TARGET. AO UTILIZED 1 FLIGHT OF FIXED WING WITH CUTSTANDING COVERAGE OF TARGET AREA.

021850H VIC. ZCO31436 CH-46'S AND GUNSHIPS ARRIVED ON STATION AND HELICOP-TER LOWERED THE JUNGLE PENETRATOR TO HOIST OUT THE WOUNDED. THE ASSISTANT PATROL LEADER WAS HOISTED OUT WITHOUT AND INCIDENT AND THE PENETRATOR WAS LOWERED TO EXTRACT THE PATROL LEADER. TEAM HOOKED UP THE LT. (LT. SKIDDE) WOULD NOT FALL CFF. ON THE FIRST TRY THE CADLE GOT CAUGHT IN THE CANOPY AND THE TEAM IROKE THE CALLE LOOSE FROM THE CANCPY AND TEAM OBSERVED THE LT. PENETRATE THE CANCPY AND WAS APPROXIMATELY 100 FRET OFF THE GROUND WHEN TEAM STARTED TO PUT ON THEIR GEAR AND AFTER THE TEAM GOT THEIR GEAR ON THEY ODSERVED THE HELICOPTER. THE LADDER WAS LOWERED AND THE TEAM WAS THEN EXTRACTED. TEAM STATES THAT THEY
THEODHT THE LT. WAS ADOARD THE HELICOPTER AND DIDN'NT KNOW AND DIFFERENT UNTIL TEAM WAS SET DOWN AT AN HOA AND THE COMPANY COMMANDER APPROACHED THEM AND WANTED TO KNOW WHELE THE LT. WAS. PATROL STATES THEY DID NOT HEAR ANYTHING FALL OR HIT THE GROUND.

- 6, TER MIN: AREA WAS GENERALLY ROLLING WITH 25-40 CANOPY AND VERY THEY (TEAM COULD OBSERVE THE SKY LINE) WITH SECONDARY CHOWITH OF 2-41 CONSIS-TOWG OF TANGLE VINES, SMALL SHRUBS, 1-2! ELEPHANT CRASS AND THORN/THIAR DUSHES MOVEMENT WAS MODERATE TO EASY AND TEAM TRAVELED 250-300 METERS PER HOUR FOR A RECON PATROL. WATER WAS IN THE LOW CROUNDS AND IT WAS NOT SEASONAL. ANIMAL Tipe consisted of dirds. Insects, files, ands, and spiders. Streameds CONSISTED MOSTLY OF RUCKS.
- 7. OTHER INFORMATION: INSERT LZ VIC. ZCOSOMIO CONSISTING OF REAR WHEEL THE MEASURING 35X40 ON A STEEP SLOPE WITH A 35 DEGREE SLANT. ZONE WAS CONSTITUTED WERY POOR DUE TO THE HELICOPTER HAVING TO DACK INTO ZONE FROM THE FAST. EXTRACT LZ VIC. ZCO31436 POUR LADDER ZONE DUE TO CANOPY IN THE ANDA. TEAM WAS EXTRACTED BY LADDER. TRAILS: TRAIL VIC. 2002 2439 RUNNING EAST TO WEST, TEAM COULD ONLY OBSERVE APPROXIMATELY 4-5: OF TRAIL AND IT ACPEARED TO JE HEAVILY USED AT PRESENT TIME. TRAIL VIC. ZCO30440 RUNNING SOUTHEAST TO NURTHEAST 8"-3" WIDE AND PRESENTLY BEING USED (TEAM MADE CONTACT ON TRAIL). OP'S: OP VIC. 


